MORLEY BUILDS ON DOUBLE STOREY

ROB STOREY won two of the three races – but series leader Ben Morley had increased his lead by the end of round four of the NSW State Formula Ford Championship on July 29-30.

In a guest appearance Storey (Stealth Van Diemen) was dynamite in qualifying, securing pole from Morley (Spectrum) with Kristian Lindbom (Spectrum) next, ahead of Leigh Burges (Stealth), Kyle Wood and Stephen Payne (Van Diemen RF98s), and Nick Lowe's Spectrum, a winner at the previous round.

Morley got the jump in race one and led Storey, Burges and Lindbom. Burges was displaced by Lindbom on lap two before Storey moved into the lead and won. Lowe took fifth ahead of Payne and 2002 champ Matthew Howard (Van Diemen) while Wood failed to go the distance.

Storey won the start of race two and Lindom ran with him. Morley slotted into third and bided his time before making his move, snaring Lindbom on lap four and

Storey the following lap. The latter fell to fifth before retaking fourth behind Payne.

Morley didn't get a very good jump at the start of race three. Lindbom and Storey led him around on lap one. On lap two Storey made his move on Lindbom leaving him and Morley to dice for the minor positions.

On lap four Morley was through to second but couldn't run down the leader. Lindbom maintained third ahead of Burges, Payne and Lowe who failed to get a result in race two. **DH**
